

With a diverse population of 270 million, living in an archipelago of 17,000 islands, Indonesia encounters numerous challenges in health sectors. Currently, there are six main health issues in Indonesia: maternal and child health, stunting, infectious and non-infectious disease, healthy life movement (GERMAS), national health insurance (JKN) and the national health system. If you are interested in knowing how the government and society in Indonesia are dealing with these six issues, the success stories as well as the lessons learnt, you are welcome to join our short course.

The course (equivalent to 1 credit) will be conducted for a week. Each day covers a course on one specific public health issue for two hours, a visit to public health provider, and one cultural activity. This course is useful for you who are planning to conduct research on Indonesia, starting your career in Indonesia, and/or if you just want to know more about Indonesia.
