BRIEF PROFILE OF UNIMMA-IUPL FACULTY OF LAW UNIVERSITAS MUHAMMADIYAH MAGELANG

G. Student Welfare

H. Student Mobility

1. Inbound

- a. Students Exchange Program (SEP) is conducted between UNIMMA and Partner Universities;
- b. The exchange program can be a short-term (less than a semester) and long-term program (at least one semester or more). (dual-degree if possible);
- c. Funding schemes is necessary during the exchange program

- (free tuition waiver, UNIMMA scholarship, etc.);
- d. The availability of Student dormitory;
- e. Required SEP documents (Completed Application Form, Soft-copy file of Passport-sized photograph (4x6 cm/in color/red background), Scanned-Passport, Curriculum Vitae or Resume, Recommendation Letter from Home University, Academic Transcript (GPA), Financial Statement Letter from Parents/Guardians, and Medical Certificate.).

Credits Transfer and Remedial Program

- a. The credit of the courses and the marks at UNIMMA will be accepted equally as many as the credit and marks at Home University, and the credits will be transferred as the takencredits at Home University.
- b. The number of courses and credits during the exchange program should not exceed their credits or courses in their Home University during the intake semester or year.
- c. The students can do a remedial of any courses that they miss or fail during the period of exchange program.
- d. Transfer credits and academic transcript issued by Faculty of Law-UNIMMMA.

2. Outbound

- a. SEP is provided for all Law students
- b. The exchange program can be a short-term (less than a semester) and long-term program (at least one semester or more).
- c. Those who are interested to join the program are required to submit: A copy of Valid Passport, Curriculum Vitae, Recommendation Letter, Academic Transcripts (GPA), TOEFL (ITP), Motivation letter, Financial Statement Letter and attend the selection process.
- d. The students can choose Universities based on the Program offered
- e. The selected student will be elected by their academic

- performance, writing skills, and interview performance.
- f. The result of the students that are selected is final and the students cannot withdraw from this program.
- g. The students should follow the regulation of both Home University (Universitas Muhammadiyah Magelang) and Host University (The University for doing an exchange).
- h. All the costs of the student's exchange program should be provided by the students. (International Relation Office and faculty will assist them to get a waived tuition fee). * visa, passport
- i. During the program, the student should keep safe, send a monthly report to the IUP, and maintain the good name of IUP, Cooperation and International Affair and UNIMMA.
- j. Cooperation and International Relation Office will supervise and assist the student in dealing with the student's mobility such as reviewing their application, advising the student visa and academic matters.

Transfer Credit and Remedial Program

- a. The credit of the courses and the marks at the Host University will be accepted equally as much as the IUP credit and marks, and the credits will be transferred at UNIMMA-IUPL as the taken credits.
- b. The number of courses and credits that they are taking should not exceed their credits or courses in UNIMMA-IUPL during the exchange period.
- c. The students can do a remedial of any courses that they miss during the exchange.
- d. If the students do the remedial of the courses that the courses have not been taken, they can get a chance to get A. If the students do a remedial with the taken courses, they will get a mark (maximum B).
- e. The transfer credit or the transcript can be preceded and sent by Host University to International Relation Office or UNIMMA a month after the end of the program.

f. The marks or the grade point of courses at the Host University should be submitted directly to International Relation Office or UNIMMA in a form of an official letter.


